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Dear Friends,

Later on in this newsletter, in a segment called "What a Year," we share the dramatic numbers we have been experiencing here at the Food Bank of Siouxland. In short, we are seeing records falling and the number of pounds we are distributing growing. We are currently projecting we will distribute a record-shattering 2.5 million pounds of food in fiscal year 2019 (ending 9/30/2019). I have spoken before about the contradiction these numbers seem to present in this era of low unemployment, when the news is full of positive reports about the economy. Unfortunately, the story told by these numbers says clearly that working does not always equate an income that keeps pace with demand and need. So many people live paycheck to paycheck with no room for unexpected expenses or extras. "Making ends meet" is a challenge for many, and so we are grateful that we, along with our partners, can help fill that gap and ensure that everyone has access to sufficient nutrition. My focus here is helping to explain who that "WE" represents, and how do our partners help us with this work?

First of all, it's important to understand that the Food Bank of Siouxland operates as a warehouse and the majority of our foods are distributed by the case and by the pallet. We don't directly serve individuals and families for the most part, but rather our focus is bringing foods together from many resources, and distributing it to our network of agency partners so that they can assist the people who come to them. That network of agency partners, nearly 100 of them across our 11 county service area, are primarily food pantries and meal sites. These partners are a critical component of the food bank process, and we couldn't meet the needs of food insecure Siouxlanders without them! Agencies order by the case from our online menu, and either pick up those orders or have us deliver pallets of food to their location. In addition to this aspect of our work, we have several programs that also address hunger but in a more direct way: the BackPack Program: *Food for Kids*, the Mobile Pantry Program: *Food to You*, the Mobile School Pantry: *Food for Families*, and the newest concept for providing food to those in need, School Pantries.

As you can see, our business has many elements that all require resources – food, infrastructure, and funds. That represents the next type of partner in our work: our donors. Food donors, financial donors, even donors who help us fix, maintain, or improve the things we need to operate.

We need the building, the freezers and coolers, the racking, the pallet jacks and forklift, the computers and software, and the ability to pay the bills just to keep all this food coming in and out. It is important to note that we are a relatively small nonprofit and again, we could not do this vital work without the generosity of our Siouxland community!

Throughout the year, we reach out to you all in a variety of ways – newsletters, mail pieces that talk about current activities in each season, and our all-important fundraising/friendraising events. Every one of these mailings and opportunities are our chance to tell the story of the needy in Siouxland and ask you to be our partner in fighting hunger. You are a vital part of this team and we simply couldn't do this work without each of you. I believe, as I hope you do, that TOGETHER, WE CAN SOLVE HUNGER.

It's also wonderful to recognize that the top two food categories responsible for the incredible number of pounds distributed are meat and fresh produce.
